

First documented cremation in Australia



First documented cremation of a European in Australia (1895)






Open air cremation was still happening in the 1930's in Western Australia


Plans for the first Crematorium at West Terrace in Adelaide – built in 1903





Cremation at Springvale Necropolis Victoria in 1905






The first cremation at Melbourne's Springvale Necropolis in 1905. The ground was excavated and an elaborate temporary cremator constructed with brick piers, iron girders and plates, and six tons of kerosene soaked firewood. The Rev. Edward Veale conducted the religious service. (Springvale Necropolis Trust)

Cremator at Springvale Necropolis Victoria (1920's)






Springvale Necropolis cremator in the 1920s. After the first few cremations, the basic brick and iron by Frederick Cook was periodically rebuilt and upgraded, but it remained a very primitive facility and 1929. There were fewer than 200 cremations at Springvale in the period the basic cremators were in

Design - Rookwood Crematorium, Sydney NSW - 1924






Frank Bloomfield's original design for the Rookwood Crematorium 1924.

His inspiration came from the North Italian Romanesque style adopted for Manchester Crematorium and Golders Green Crematorium, which carried on ecclesiastical overtones but set them apart from traditional Gothic (Mitchell Library)














